Program Overview

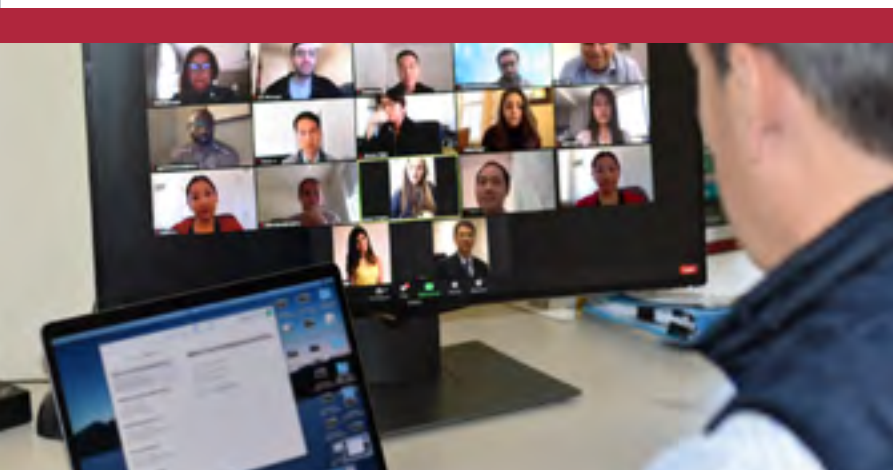
To successfully train the next generation of health care professionals, medical educators must utilize advanced teaching strategies and techniques in both classroom and clinical settings. Training to Teach in Medicine helps scholars to expand their knowledge and sharpen their expertise in medical education.

This contemporary program integrates traditional and novel pedagogic methods, skills-based training, two live virtual workshops, webinars, individual and team projects, as well as a final capstone project to benefit your university or institution.

Upon program completion, participants will:

- Understand the process of adult learning and how it should impact medical education
- Recognize underlying theory from a conceptual perspective, incorporating learning sciences and other justifications for the content
- Identify and implement the necessary elements for successful curriculum reform
- Integrate simulation and modern technology to enhance teaching and learning
- Apply the core ethical principles of medical education research to classroom and clinical teaching

Collectively, this curriculum is designed to accelerate your essential teaching proficiencies while minimizing time away from your professional and instructional responsibilities.



Program Highlights

The online nature of this certificate program gives you the feasibility and flexibility to connect with a global network of medical educators from your home.

Our program begins with an intensive, synchronous workshop, as you meet your peers and program faculty, and first engage with the program curriculum. You will then partake in meaningful modules and webinars, as you learn course content and work towards your teaching goals. Throughout Training to Teach in Medicine, you will have access to a dynamic course platform, on-demand modules and additional strategic resources to help you excel during your time in the program, including Harvard Medical School's vast online library collection.

Upon successful completion of the program requirements, you will receive a Certificate of Completion. You will then be eligible to become an Associate Member of the Harvard Medical School Alumni Association, an extensive network of scholars focused on improving the future of medicine. You'll also have access to alumni social networks and events, where our community will continue to be a resource for you as you enter the next stages of your career.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

This program requires a high level of English proficiency. Our learners typically hold a doctoral-level degree in a health-related subject and are engaged in medical education.

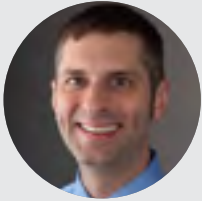
During the application process, you will be asked to submit:
