



## About the Program

Training to Teach in Medicine is a six-month online program that helps medical educators, faculty, and instructors obtain the skills, strategies and techniques required to educate diverse medical students and adult learners in classroom, remote, ambulatory and bedside settings.

## What to Expect

By studying educational theories and best practices for physicians-in-training, program participants will explore modern medical education pedagogy and advanced instruction techniques. Through hands-on skill development and active learning modules, scholars will leave the program with a framework to educate medical learners in practice.

## Format

Over the course of six months, program participants will partake in a series of self-paced online lectures, focused symposia, tutorials and seminars, as well as individual and group projects. An interactive, live virtual workshop will occur at the start and conclusion of the program, bringing together dynamic medical educators from across the globe.

## Who Should Apply

This program is for highly motivated faculty, lecturers and instructors in local, regional and international medical schools seeking to gain strong classroom and clinical teaching skill sets.

Pharmacists, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, dentists or other health care professionals teaching in clinical and medical education settings are welcome to apply.
